From the Principal's Desk:

Social Emotional Learning and CARES at Pettigrew-

CARES stand for the first letters of the words -- Cooperation, Assertive, Responsibility, Empathy, and Self-Control. CARES is an important component of our social skills curriculum and program called Responsive Classroom that has been a foundation at Pettigrew since it opened. It also plays in nicely with our Character Education efforts

and it really is a piece of citizen education as well – what it means to be a good citizen at Pettigrew Elementary and every other community we are a part of. Each of the first five months of the year, as part of our on-going #BeYouBePettigrew campaign, we focus on each one of these five words during our morning announcements and during our Morning Meetings in the classrooms. We talk about what it means to Be Cooperative, Be Assertive, Be Responsible, Show Empathy and Have Self-Control. At the end of each month of school, we involve all the staff at school to recognize one student member of each classroom that has done a nice job that month of exhibiting the characteristic we are focusing on. They come to the office, get their picture taken as a group with their grade-level peers, and receive a nice certificate and a special coupon they can redeem at a restaurant in town. The last 3 or 4 months of the year, we move on to another word of the month, but all we do and practice and teach in the area of community and getting along with others can be traced back to these 5 core values that we celebrate and learn about at Pettigrew.

The Pettigrew Panther Pledge-

Last year, a group of teachers at Pettigrew wrote a pledge that we, as a school, recite and review each week on the first day of the week. It incorporates all the principles that our school focuses on with CARES. You may hear it, see it or read it around Pettigrew at some point. Its words go something like this --

I will cooperate, the Pettigrew way

I'll be assertive, in a positive way!

I am responsible, it's a choice I made

- I'll show empathy, no matter the day!
- My Self-Control -- is something I need
- If I give it my all, I will succeed!

Valentines Party Change of Procedures -

In the interest of continuing to promote safety and security at Pettigrew, and because of some potential incidents that have occurred at Pettigrew and other area schools, our admission procedures to the Valentines Party is going to look a bit different this February. As you know, to be admitted to school during regular school hours, a government issued photo-ID with scanning capabilities (usually your SD

Drivers License) is provided to the office clerical, it is scanned to check it against several restricted lists of people who may not be able to visit public schools, and then your ID is kept and a time-stamped visitor sticker is issued. When a visitor checks out, they turn in the sticker and their badge is returned as they leave.

For the Valentine's Party, we **ARE GOING TO SCAN** all visitor's IDs, but we will **NOT KEEP** the ID during this function. You will receive a visitor sticker that **is not** time stamped and **does not** need to be turned back in, simply discard the sticker as you leave the event and there is no need to check out in the office. We anticipate this scanning process **will take more time** than the previous sign-in-and-receive-a-sticker process we have followed for previous parties. Please plan ahead and also, when the traffic gets busy, please plan to wait for a while, as we only have two clerical and one scanner. In preparation of this process, we will begin scanning badges at 1:30 pm, but approved parents will be asked to wait until they are admitted to the Valentine's Party at 1:50 pm. **PLEASE NOTE**—If your student is a bus rider and they will be going home with you, please notify the office of this change before 2:00 on the day of the change. Our bus lists are prepared each day by 2:00, and after that time, changes are difficult to make.

We would also like to limit our visitors to only the parents or guardians who have indicated to their classroom teachers that they will be attending the party, and that the purpose of these parent/guardians is to assist with the party in the classroom. This change is so that the students may be our primary focus and their enjoyment of the classroom party can be our corporate goal for the event. We realize our students enjoy these events immensely, and there is a temptation for family members and other relatives to want to come and enjoy the party with their students. However, it can be cumbersome and distracting when we have 10 or more adults added to each classroom as the students and teacher are trying to participate in their party activities. Most classrooms welcome a couple of key parents to help with setting up, leading or participating in the games and activities. However, some relatives and other visitors have not understood this expectation of assisting at the party, and merely attend for the purpose of watching the party. We would like to encourage you to have a special event outside of school for your family and relatives that CAN include all family members, even those not of school age or those beyond Pettigrew's grade level, but limit the number attending the school party to those parents/guardians who have communicated with the classroom teacher and are designated to assist in the party activities. Thank you for your understanding and flexibility in this area of our school life.

Here are some other reminders about our Classroom Party procedures:

Per school policy, no younger siblings may attend our classroom parties. Please help make this a special time for your **school-aged** children and all their classmates. **Alternative educational activities** will be provided for any students who do not celebrate Valentine's Day during this same time. Please notify your child's teacher or the office of your interest for them to be a part of this alternative activity.

Deliveries -- Pettigrew does not accept nor deliver flowers, balloons or other gift deliveries to students at any time, including during class parties or other events. Please plan for these deliveries at other locations. This does not include decorations that may be organized by the classroom teacher, but please be aware of latex or other allergens that some students should not be in contact with.

Drop off and Pick up Reminders:

It may also be a good time to remind all school visitors and parent/guardians of the following procedures surrounding morning drop off and afternoon pickup.....

- In the mornings, children should arrive NO EARLIER THAN 7:50 and go directly to the playground, unless they are eating breakfast in the Multi-Purpose Room. Breakfast begins at 7:40 am. The bell will ring at 8:05 AM and students will line up by their designated playground door to enter the building.
- If you choose to meet your child after school as they exit the building, you are expected to park in the lot and do this on the playground. The left lane of the drive-through loop needs to be kept open at all times. It is NOT for waiting in your car for students NOR for parking and going on the playground or in the building.
- After school, cars **WITH DRIVERS IN THEM** can wait in the right- hand lane. If students can find their way to your car on their own, you may wait **IN YOUR CAR** in this lane. If you need to leave your car, you **MUST** park in the lot or on the street and go to the playground or to the front door.
- Only buses or day care vans are allowed in the bus drop off area on the west side of the school.
- The circle drive in front of the school is a fire lane. It should never be used to park and go into the school or onto the playground. It is only a loading and unloading area.
- We keep the front row of parking in our lot for people who visit the school or need to park and come in.






