Anticipation for Next Year!!!

As the school year comes to an end, we want to remind all our families of the importance of monitoring the social and emotional health of our children with intentionality to maintain positive growth. We all want the same thing for our students and our children. We want them to be happy, to overcome challenges, to have positive emotions, to build meaningful relationships, to be engaged in life, and to attain authentic accomplishments.

As we reflect on this unprecedented year, we want to assure you that Pettigrew Elementary will continue to focus on the social and emotional well-being of our students. As part of that commitment to our students and families, we have chosen to adopt a new social-emotional learning platform called 7 Mindsets. This program promotes self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision making. The students learn the mindsets each week through engaging lessons, activities, discussions, journaling, and reflective exercises.

The 7 Mindsets are based upon three years of research that started with a simple question: What do the world's happiest and most successful people have in common? The research revealed that the gamechanging commonalities of happiness and success are based on how the world's most successful people think. The 7 Mindsets are Everything is Possible, Passion First, We are Connected, 100% Accountable, Attitude of Gratitude, Live to Give, and The Time is Now.



The goal is to encourage positive conversations, connections, and relationships at school, at home, and in the community. Each week they will share in fun and engaging activities to empower growth, happiness, and success.

We continue to appreciate the support you have shown to our school staff and the culture of Pettigrew. PTO has also been very supportive and embraced our efforts in this area, and we anticipate their continued support as we seek to engage families in this program. We have had one fund-raiser to support this new program with Boss Pizza and Chicken over the spring break weekend that our Pettigrew parents supported in terrific fashion and we were able to raise \$414.66 for this new program. We are actively pursuing other funding to bring more components of this comprehensive program into play next year, as we work to implement it. 
TEACHER APPRECIATION WEEK MAY 3-7, 2021
